Every year, an estimated 4.2 million youth and young adults experience homelessness*. Youth can directly impact their peers and become informed and compassionate citizens by engaging in activism around homelessness.





CLIMATE CHANGE

Civic education on climate change is crucial. It promotes sustainable policies, helps secure a habitable planet for future generations, and tackles environmental injustices. This empowers young individuals to become environmental guardians.

CRIMINAL JUSTICE REFORM

Youth civic education on criminal justice reform can help those to understand systemic injustices, advocate for fairness and equality, and recognize the broader societal implications. It can also foster empathy and compassion towards those affected by the criminal justice system.





EDUCATION REFORM

Education reform enhances curriculum, pays teachers better, fosters community partnerships, and leverages technology to empower young people to be informed, engaged citizens who can contribute to their communities and beyond.
